

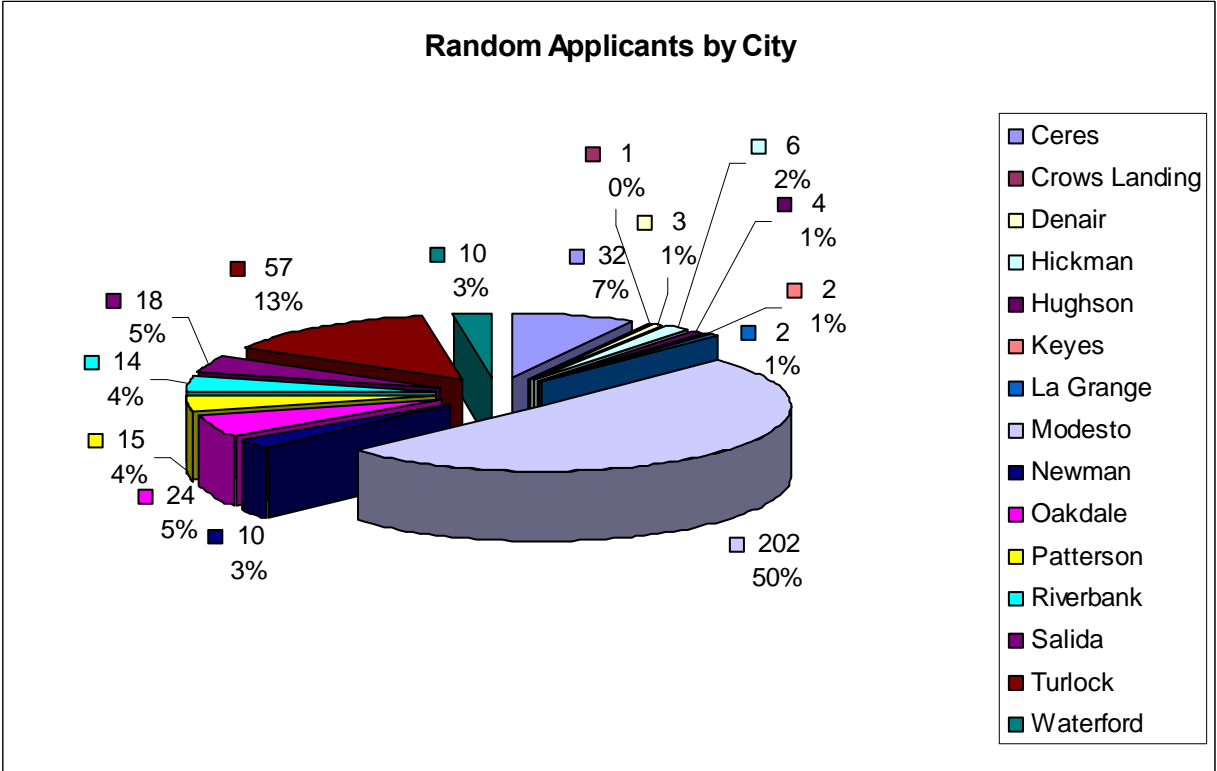
2009-2010 CIVIL GRAND JURY SELECTION PROCESS STATISTICS

PHASE I: INITIAL CONTACT

Letters mailed to:

A. **400 names randomly selected from the Master Jury Pool of 264,119 names.**

- 10 responded interested (2.5%)
- 7 responded interested; later withdrew (1.75%)
- 171 responded not interested (42.75%)
- 9 moved outside of County (2.25%)
- 139 did not respond (34.75%)
- 64 returned as undeliverable (16.0%)



B. **136 Community Leaders were asked to submit names of prospective jurors.**

- 3 responded with names (2.2%)
- 133 did not respond (97.8%)

3 names were submitted by 3 Community Leaders.

- 2 responded interested (66.7%)
- 1 responded not interested (33.3%)

These 3 individuals represented the cities of Modesto, Newman and Turlock.

C. **80 persons requested application forms.**

- 55 submitted applications (68.75%)
- 24 submitted applications (30.0%)
& later withdrew
- 1 applicant was disqualified (1.25%)

D. **22 persons from last year's selection process were contacted.**

- 3 responded interested (13.6%)
- 1 responded not interested (4.6%)
- 4 indicated interest, later withdrew (18.2%)
- 14 did not respond (63.6%)

PHASE II: INTERVIEWS/SELECTION OF 30:

- A. There were 87 prospective jurors scheduled for interviews. Sixty-seven (77%) completed the interview process; 20 (23%) withdrew or did not appear.
- B. As required by the Penal Code, 30 names were selected from those interviewed -- 16 ((53.3%) females and 14 (46.7%) males.
- C. Of the 30 persons selected; 26 (86.6%) had requested an application, two (6.7%) names were recommended, and two (6.7%) came from last year's applicants.

PHASE III: SELECTION OF THE 19-MEMBER PANEL:

- A. From the list of 30, 18 names were drawn at random and one was appointed Foreperson by the Presiding Judge. One person was a holdover from the 2008-2009 Grand Jury. Four additional names were drawn as alternate members.

Of the 19 selected to serve on the Grand Jury, 14 (73.7%) had requested applications, community leaders had submitted two names (10.5%), two (10.5%) names came from last year's applicants, and one (5.3%) was a holdover.

The new panel consisted of seven (36.8%) females and 12 (63.2%) males, representing the following communities:
