

## 2010-2011 CIVIL GRAND JURY SELECTION PROCESS STATISTICS

**PHASE I: INITIAL CONTACT**

Letters mailed to:

A. **400 names randomly selected from the Master Jury Pool of 242,402 names.**

- 21 responded interested (5.25%)
- 4 did not qualify (1.0%)
- 177 responded not interested (44.25%)
- 6 moved outside of County (1.5%)
- 145 did not respond (36.25%)
- 47 returned as undeliverable (11.75%)

- all 4 referrals responded interested; they represented the cities of Denair, Modesto, and Oakdale.

E. **Four jurors from the 2009-2010 Grand Jury requested to hold over for the 2010-2011 jury panel.**

**PHASE II: INTERVIEWS/SELECTION OF 30:**

A. There were **60** prospective jurors scheduled for interviews. **45** (75%) completed the interview process; **15** (25%) withdrew or did not appear.

B. As required by the Penal Code, 30 names were selected from those interviewed -- **18** (60%) had requested an application, **3** (10%) were from the master jury list, **4** (13.3%) names were recommended by community leaders, and **5** (16.7%) came from last year's applicants.

Of the 30 names **13** (43.3%) were females and **17** (56.7%) males.

**PHASE III: SELECTION OF THE 19-MEMBER PANEL:**

- A. From the list of 30, 15 names were drawn at random. Four persons were allowed to hold over from the 2009-2010 Grand Jury, which completed the 19-member panel. The Presiding Judge appointed one of the hold over jurors as the Grand Jury Foreperson. Four additional names were drawn as alternate members. An alternate serves if a regular grand juror resigns or is removed.

Of the 19 individuals selected to serve on the Grand Jury, 7 (36.8%) had requested applications, 2 (10.5%) came from the master jury pool, 1 (5.3%) was referred by a community leader, 5 (26.3%) came from last year's applicants, and four (21.1%) held over from the 2009-2010 jury.

The new panel consisted of 9 females (47.4%) and 10 males (52.6%); representing the following communities:
