CONFERENCE CALL MATTER

At 8:06 a.m. this case is regularly called for hearing in an open
courtroom in Department 6. The courtroom doors are open and the public
has full access.

Court and counsel discuss the status of Mr. Carson's caseload.

Counsel states that Preciliano Martinez, Esq. has fully substituted in on
Mr. Carson's civil case.

There is one appointed criminal case left involving Defendant Miranda. In
that matter Preciliano Martinez, Esq. is waiting for the next hearing to
address this.

There are three clients that cannot be located. Mr. Carson is planning to
file motions to withdrawal as counsel in those matters. The Court will
accept notice to be mailed to those clients' last known addresses.
Counsel states that these motions will be filed within a week.

Counsel states that the status of the retained cases are as follows:

Seven clients have approved Mr. Martinez, Esq. to associate as counsel in their matters.

16 clients have signed their consents for association of counsel and they will be filed at their next Court dates.

13 clients have consented, but have not yet signed their association of counsel documents.

The State Bar's counsel agrees to allow counsel more time to procure any outstanding client matters. The Court is satisfied with the progress thus far.

Court discusses with Stephanie Kennedy the issues of customers having to file documents in this matter with a supervisor only in civil. Ms. Kennedy addresses these issues and states that this is not the case and that a new clerk was given some documents for filing that she was not yet trained on and asked a supervisor for assistance. Filings in this case can be made in the usual course, not solely by a supervisor.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

Court orders that counsel have until October 12, 2015 to complete the necessary paperwork on the on the association of counsel matters.

This matter is **CONTINUED to October 9, 2015 in Department 6 at 8:00 a.m.** for further review of the State Bar's application for assumption of law practice. This will be a conference call and parties are instructed to call in at the same number as was done today.
