The list of appointed doctors will be referenced with a standard turnaround time for examination reports five (5) weeks. If the doctors appointed are unable to provide a report during that period of time, a specific request will need to be made to the judge of that particular case.

Minute Orders from the case regarding the appointment will be sent within 48 hours to the appointed doctor's office.

Examinations for 1368 cases will produce a report based on the following information:

- Police Reports
- Minute Order
- CLETS printout
- Medical/psychiatric records
- Jail medical records

Examinations for 1026 cases will produce a report based on the following information:

- Police Reports
- Minute Order
- CLETS printout
- Medical/psychiatric records
- Jail medical records

In the event that an attorney feels that there is information beyond the standard examination material to be reviewed for the 1026 report or the 1368 report, written request and explanation must be submitted to the Supervising Criminal Judge. In the event that the case is assigned to the Supervising Criminal Judge, the information will be forwarded to the Supervising Criminal Judge's designee. Any information that is not on the standard material list and not approved by the Supervising Criminal Judge or his/her designee, will be disregarded by the appointed doctor.

In the event that the standard list of doctors for Stanislaus County Superior Court has been exhausted for availability, the court will consider availability from the San Joaquin County, Merced County and Fresno County lists of available doctors.

*Any increase in non-discovery related fees **must** be pre-approved by the Supervising Criminal Judge.*

Attorney signature on fee claim is *not* required.
